## REGION 2 SUMMIT

COMM Richard L. Trulson Soggy Summit is full of fun and surprises.

The fifth annual Region 2 "Sunny Summit" was held March 10-13, 2000, in Birmingham, AL. Normally, the Summit is rotated among the four zones. Therefore, this year should have been in Zone 5, Puerto Rico or the Caribbean Islands. But since there isn't a chapter there yet, the Chief of Summit opened the bidding to anyone in the Region. The USS Hephaestus in Birmingham, which had helped with the 1998 Summit, won the 2000 bid. Pete Mohney was originally the Summit Chairman, but he turned over the responsibilities to Danny Potts, the new Hephaestus CO, once Pete became the Regional Coordinator.

I carpooled down to the Summit on Friday afternoon with the USS *Draco* crew. The *Draco* CO, XO, (Dallas Vinson and James Whatley) and another crewmember also shared a room with me. We checked in just before 4 p.m. when registration opened. We unloaded our stuff into our second floor room. We were surrounded by the Potts' (Danny and Denby, Region 2's "mother" and Chief of Treasury) on one side and a couple of *Dark Silence* crewmembers on the other.

Parts of downtown Birmingham were without power and suffered damage from either straight-line winds or small tornadoes. Flash flood watches and warnings were also issued. It also rained throughout the day on Saturday as well, though nothing like the monsoon on Friday evening. As a result, the Soggy Summit became the running joke of the weekend.

After the short mix and mingle, over 50 people drove a short distance to the Lone Star steak house. A few got upset because the directions listed the Long Horn as the actual restaurant. I scared the *Draco* crew once by nearly rear-ending the car in front of me. But other than that, the dinner was fabulous. In addition to the good camaraderie, the food was delicious. The rest of the evening was a slow build-up to Saturday's events. At one point, Danny hosted a "Who Wants To Be A Latnumaire?" game. The winners with the most "gold pressed latinum" at the end of the game won some free prizes, including a Star Wars Monopoly game. The Region 2 Store was also open. In addition to the quartermaster merchandise, a couple of sci-fi merchandise dealers were also there. Items for the Auction were also on display for early, silent bidding.

I attended a Region 2 staff meeting since I'm the Chief of Computer Operations. Nothing too Earth shattering was discussed. Basically, we gave a brief update on what each of us was doing and what we were trying to accomplish. The importance of communication with each other, the RC, the VRC, and the members were discussed. We were also to make sure we had a Vice-Chief. If something were to happen to us, the Vice-Chief could fill in temporarily to prevent something important from being missed.

The evening was brought to a close with the annual Great Dalmuti tournament. People stayed up till late playing this addictive card game. Snacks and drinks throughout the weekend were provided by the host chapter of the 2001 Summit.

Saturday started at 8:30 a.m. with the Opening Ceremonies. The Star Spangled Banner was played after the Marines marched in as color guard for the flags. Mike Henigan, Chief of Summit, briefly welcomed everyone to the Summit. Danny Potts, Summit Chairman, followed with a brief discussion on what he gets out of fleet: friends.

Regional Coordinator Pete Mohney spoke next by welcoming the newest chapters to commission since the last Summit. This included the USS Draco (CO is Dallas Vinson), the USS Jubilee (Tony Goretski), and the USS Dräkenfire (Alice Strange). Jennifer Rosbury, the Vice-Regional Coordinator, then performed a roll call of all the chapters in the Region. Being the only one to stand for the von Braun felt strange,

especially since we were so close to Birmingham and the costs were so cheap this year. Other chapters have anywhere from 5 to 15 people in attendance.

Commander STARFLEET, FADM Mike Smith spoke next with a state of Fleet address. He recognized the Fleet Staff members that were in attendance with him, including STARFLEET Chief of Operations Les Rickard. Mike reminded everyone that this would be his last year as Commander, STARFLEET, since the Constitution prevents anyone from serving in that position for more than two terms. Even though he had accomplished most of what he set out to do, he was burned out from the job. Because of the state Fleet was in when he was elected, he's honestly surprised by how well Fleet is doing now, which is an indication of the hard work and determination of his staff and of Fleet members in general. He encouraged everyone to "get out and vote" in this year's elections for Commander, STARFLEET, since this is the one time members have a direct influence on Fleet. He thanked everyone for their support, saying "It has meant a lot to me."

Jack Hopkins spoke next as the Region 1 VRC, which had two chapters present. Jennifer Rosbury spoke next and presented Mike Smith with a T-shirt from Debora Maestu of the USS Blackstar. This T-shirt would be auctioned or raffled off. It's a T-shirt from the infamous Will Wheaton convention that first revealed that Dan McGinnis, the prior Commander STARFLEET, might not be as trustworthy as he seemed. There was much booing and hissing of the bad memories this brought up.

Cindi DeMidio, the 2000 STARFLEET International Conference chairman, closed out the Opening Ceremony with a slide show for the IC. People ooohed and aaahed at the gorgeous, though expensive, host hotel, and at the Vermont scenery. One of the nearby featured attractions is the Ben and Jerry's ice-cream store, which got noted chocolate lover Jo Banister's attention.

The rest of the morning was split among the various panels. I left immediately for the CO's panel. After it was over, I dropped by the registration table to submit the Wernher von Braun entries for the stampede and OCP competitions. By the time I finished that, I popped into the remaining part of the Recruiting panel. I would have liked to have attended the Decipher Star Trek Customizable Card Game introduction. It turns out the Decipher representative is from Huntsville!

At noon, I headed across the street to have lunch at Burger Afterwards, I hosted the newsletter and fanzine panel with Dennis Evans, who produces the Hephaestus newsletter, The Anvil. I would have liked to have attended the panel by Lee Shakelford, who was a writer for Star Trek: The Next Generation; however, it was over by the time I was finished with my

panel. Therefore, I perused the Region 2 store for merchandise. I bought a Babylon 5 poster, but resisted buying the gorgeous Region 2 polo shirt. While I was there, I ran into the Summit T-shirt maker, who I discovered was from Elkmont, which is a few miles south of me.

I dropped by the Auction next, which was entertaining as always. I purchased a 10" G'Kar doll that was autographed by Andreas Katsulas, and a "family" of 6 furry Tribbles. The autographed Gowron button that the ship donated went for \$8 I believe.

Then Pete awarded me a special Certificate of Appreciation for my hard work as Chief of Computer Operations. That made my night.

The evening was brought to a close with a dance. I retreated to my room to change into something more comfortable than my uniform. When I returned, the Tribble Toss didn't seem to materialize, so I'm not sure if or when I

missed it. The night was spent chatting with friends and consuming Romulan Ale. I was thanked by several members for awarding them their Cyberspace Award, which made all the hassles and headaches worthwhile. I was also

Jennifer Rosbury spoke next and thanked everyone for a good time. The Regional Department Chiefs are working on getting in touch with the region's members, and promoting their activities more. Pete Mohney also announced that he had a gift certificate to amazon.com for Brian Davis, the Marine Commandant, and Mike Smith for taking the time out of their busy schedules to attend the Region 2 Summit. Danny Potts then closed the Summit by thanking everyone for attending. He announced that the 2001 Summit will be held March 9-11. Since they were able to get better and cheaper hotel rates, the 2001 Summit will be held in Mobile, AL even though the host chapter, the USS *Continuum*, is located in Pensacola, FL.

You miss a fabulous time if you don't attend the Summit. The panels are not only informative, but they're fun. Furthermore, the camaraderie with other *Star Trek* fans is incredibly enjoyable. Therefore, start saving your money now to attend the 2001 Summit. I plan on being there and would like to take a large contingent of the *von Braun* with me.
